The Fifth Biennial Midwest Forum on Regeneration will be held at Michigan State University on June 6 - 9, 1985. As you know, these meetings in the past have always been well attended by workers in the field, and have been structured such that workers can exchange information as freely as possible.

As with previous conferences, we shall not tamper with proven methods, both in terms of the manner in which papers are presented and the other more informal opportunities which often seem equally important. We cordially invite you to attend, and remind you that the event is particularly valuable in terms of acquainting students or others interested with specific enthusiasms and proclivities of those in the field, and with the various viewpoints on the problems themselves.

We also anticipate that the presentations will reflect what is surely a time of increased ferment in the field. Investigations relative to general morphogenetic controls, and to specific chemical agents have been particularly fruitful recently. We do hope that you will yourself be able to present a paper on any topic related to regeneration; attendees and speakers alike have commented that this opportunity is one of the most painless and effective ways of presenting a regeneration paper. It is a fine place for students to learn to ply their trade as well.

Enclosed is a preliminary response sheet which we shall use to send more specific information on housing and programs sometime in February. We must have the sheet back by December 15, or risk disruptions in accommodations.

Late spring in East Lansing is a particularly pleasant time. The leaves are all out, the weather is usually fine, at least not too hot yet, and all of the events and interactions that characterize a very large university in session are in full swing.

Sessions will be held at Kellogg Center, a hotel-like operation on the campus itself. Rooms can be engaged there, at Butterfield House, a remodeled

dormitory across the street, or at surrounding motels (e.g., Red Roof Inn, Harley Hotel, or the University Inn). Most of the motels will require a car to get to Kellogg with any convenience. Eating establishments abound; you will surely have no trouble getting fed, regardless of pocketbook or ethnic fancies.

We hope you will be able to attend.
